The Social Impact Space 2024

In 2024, Africa's social landscape was shaped by ongoing efforts to recover from the economic, health, and environmental challenges exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic. Economic instability persisted, with many countries grappling with high inflation, rising debt, and unemployment. The World Bank noted that economic growth remained uneven, with sub-Saharan Africa's growth projected to be modest at around 3.5%. This slow growth continued to impact poverty levels, with millions still living in extreme poverty despite targeted interventions and international aid.

Health remained a critical issue, with the region continuing to battle not only COVID-19 but also endemic diseases like malaria and HIV/AIDS. According to the WHO, significant strides were made in increasing vaccination coverage, yet access to healthcare services remained inequitable, highlighting the need for robust health infrastructure improvements. Gender-based violence (GBV) continued to be a significant concern, with one in three women experiencing physical or sexual violence. Legislative reforms and international support aimed to address GBV, but challenges persisted.

Technological advancements provided a beacon of hope, with digital financial services expanding and fostering economic inclusion. The World Bank reported that over 65% of adults in sub-Saharan Africa had access to a financial account, driven by mobile money innovations. These advancements played a crucial role in economic resilience and social change, particularly in rural and underserved communities.

Climate change impacts were increasingly severe, with extreme weather events such as droughts and floods affecting agriculture and food security.


The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) highlighted that over 25 million people were affected by climate-related disasters, underscoring the urgency for sustainable practices and international support for climate adaptation initiatives.

The Social Impact Space 2024

Africa continued to navigate the complex social challenges exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2023. Economic recovery was slow, with high inflation and rising debt levels impacting livelihoods and increasing poverty rates. According to the World Bank, economic growth in sub-Saharan Africa was projected at a modest 3.3%, with many countries facing fiscal deficits and reduced investment. Health disparities were stark, as efforts to improve vaccination coverage and healthcare access were met with logistical and infrastructural hurdles. The WHO reported that while vaccination rates for COVID-19 improved, significant gaps remained, particularly in rural areas.

Gender inequality remained a critical issue, with gender-based violence prevalent and efforts to combat it seeing mixed success. UN Women high-lighted that incidents of GBV spiked during periods of economic stress and social instability, necessitating more robust protective measures and support systems. Technological adoption, particularly in digital financial services, showed promise in enhancing economic inclusion and resilience. The World Bank noted that digital financial services expanded significantly, with more than 60% of adults in sub-Saharan Africa having access to financial accounts, driven by mobile banking.

Climate change impacts were increasingly felt, with significant disruptions to agriculture and food security. The UNEP reported severe droughts in the Horn of Africa and devastating floods in West Africa, affecting millions and exacerbating food insecurity. These events underscored the urgent need for climate adaptation and sustainable agricultural practices. The year 2023 highlighted the necessity for comprehensive and collaborative strategies to address these multifaceted social challenges and promote sustainable development in the region.



Supporting Widows with Business Grants

This year, Diatom has provided business grants to widows, empowering them to start and expand their own businesses. This initiative aligns with our Quality of Life pillar by offering financial support and opportunities for economic independence to a vulnerable population. By supporting widows, we directly contribute to gender equality, as these women gain financial stability and the ability to provide for their families. The economic empowerment of widows fosters entrepreneurship, creating a ripple effect of economic growth and innovation within communities.

Additionally, financially secure households are better positioned to afford education and healthcare, thereby improving overall educational outcomes for their children and health standards for the family. Widows Empowerment Program

A Journey of Hope and Growth

This year, Diatom has embarked on a heartfelt mission to empower widows across Nigeria, transforming lives and fostering sustainable growth. Each month, we invest in 10 widows from different states, starting with Ife, Nasarawa, and Abeokuta. These women, who primarily run small businesses as informal traders selling food and other items, have been selected to receive 100,000 Naira each to support and expand their enterprises.

Our aim extends beyond providing financial aid. We are committed to helping these women build sustainable, thriving businesses over a six-month period, during which we monitor their progress and offer continuous assistance. Additionally, we are creating a robust network of support among these women, enabling them to share experiences, advice, and encouragement.

The impact of this initiative reaches far beyond the monetary support. By empowering these widows, we are enabling them to achieve financial independence, support their families, and contribute to their communities. Each widow's success story inspires others, creating a ripple effect of empowerment and positive change. This program not only uplifts individual women but also strengthens the social fabric, fostering resilience and hope for a brighter future.



Digital Skills Training for Prisoners

In an effort to rehabilitate and reintegrate prisoners into society, Diatom has established digital learning centers in prisons where inmates can learn valuable skills such as Graphics UI/UX, web development, and other digital competencies. This program directly enhances the Quality of Life for prisoners by providing them with the tools and knowledge needed to secure employment upon release, reducing recidivism rates. By equipping inmates with digital skills, we contribute to educational advancement and foster entrepreneurship, as these individuals are empowered to start their own businesses or join the workforce in a meaningful capacity. Providing equal opportunities for both male and female inmates supports gender equality, and the focus on mental engagement and skill acquisition positively impacts their health and well-being. This program integrates with our focus areas of education, gender equality, entrepreneurship, and health:


Education: Digital skills training provides inmates with valuable knowledge that can lead to future employment and personal development.

Health: Engaging in educational activities and skill-building improves mental health and provides a positive focus for inmates, contributing to overall well-being.





Empowering Inmates: Pioneering Change Through Digital Innovation

We are proud to partner with Kuje Medium Security Custodial Centre in Abuja to establish a groundbreaking Innovation Centre. This initiative reflects our commitment to revolutionizing rehabilitation through digital innovation, and we commend the Nigerian Correctional Service (NCoS) and the Nigerian government for their efforts in leveraging technology to enhance the lives of inmates and support their reintegration into society.

We have installed state-of-the-art hardware and software infrastructure, including laptops, internet connectivity, software, air conditioners, rechargeable fans, a solar farm, and other essential equipment. The comprehensive tech training programs span six months and accommodate 72 students per intake. Facilitated by Readland and Cisco, inmates receive training in Graphics UI/UX, GetConnected (Software, Hardware & Office Suite), and Web Development.

Kuje prison, with a capacity of over 700 inmates, serves as a beacon of hope and transformation.

This program equips inmates with marketable digital skills, fostering a sense of purpose and hope for a brighter future. By empowering inmates, we pave the way for successful reintegration, reduce recidivism, and promote economic independence.

We are excited to expand this initiative, with another Innovation Centre in development at a prison in Abeokuta. Join us in this pioneering effort to reshape lives, foster rehabilitation, and build a future where everyone has the opportunity to thrive and contribute to society.

Africa Walk 2023






